Growing in Faith

It's almost time for school to begin again; kids and mothers may disagree on how exciting this reality is! Summer seems like a time to let loose and pack the most fun into every day, a time to get away and leave your daily routine behind. These are not bad things in general, but at what cost do we unplug and unwind and unbusy our lives in the pursuit of fun and freedom?

Children are not the only ones who need a break from school, but they also need the structure and stability of the school year. They deserve a safe, stress free environment to facilitate their education and development. Adults have the same needs for leisure because our lives are a bit more restricted and regulated than even a public school. Then again, if you've seen what educators have to achieve these days, teachers and students alike may feel school has more goals to be met than fun to be had.

We need a balance, for certain, if we are going to successfully navigate our way through life. Education is an essential, not just formal education, but anything we can do to help keep our minds sharp and our thoughts clear. We should be lifelong learners. This is no less true of our spiritual education. Here at First UMC we strive to provide our young students with good Biblical understanding, a love of praise for God, a sense of joy at being together, and we see growth in our kids which is a blessing.

For the most part, adults may choose to leave the education to children or young adults. This is a shame, because there is so much more to learn. You don't have to be a reader to enjoy learning, not with a world of audio books, lectures, and discussions available. I make it a goal to listen to at least one educational lecture each day on something I know very little about. I enjoy being informed because it broadens my perspective.

Where does this bring us to, all this talk of learning and study? I believe it brings us to a place of action. Realizing that our denomination faces many difficult days ahead, I believe we need to become much more familiar with God's word not so that we know which side of matters we should be on, but so we understand what the Bible actually says about these things.

It's not easy for people to want to study the Bible for various personal reasons. It's also not easy to want to bring the joy of studying Scripture into people's lives and find that the desire is not always there. I can only encourage and continue to invite, but in time we may feel compelled to undertake a congregational focus on studying Scripture. The Church is changing, and the world is becoming an even more complicated place. God has something to say about that but it's not always enough to hear a sermon or read an article.

"God's word is alive and working and is sharper than a double-edged sword. It cuts all the way into us, where the soul and the spirit are joined, to the center of our joints and bones. And it judges the thoughts and feelings in our hearts." (Hebrews 4:12) Our minds, our hearts, our spirits can be discovered by God, and God alone knows what is at the heart of what we believe and do. I urge you to consider doing a study group or reading Scripture to keep your mind sharp, to keep your faith strong, and to keep your heart near to God.

FUMC Administrative Council Meeting Minutes July 24, 2019

I Members present: Pastor Lori Broschat, Arlene Kirk, Ray Russell, Perry Lundon, Fran Dockter, Leo Sayler, Tana Triepke, Laurel Goulding, and Marcia Ulrich.

Call to Order: Perry called meeting to order in the absence of Chairperson Chuck. Pastor Lori shared a devotion and prayer.

• Approval of Minutes: Perry called for approval of the June 2019 minutes; motion was made by Leo, seconded by Fran, motion carried.

Treasurer's Report: Perry presented the balance sheet showing a balance of \$29,748.65. There is nothing unusual in the financial reports as of June 30th. Perry moved that the report be accepted, seconded by Leo, motion carried.

Finance Committee Report: The committee has not met this month. Leo reported that the committee is following through with suggestions from Administrative Council. He would like to inform the congregation that insurance premiums and utility costs are quite high so they are aware of our fiscal obligations.

Board of Trustees Report: Ray reported on a lengthy list of items to be addressed: a) Dennis made a new step and refreshed the paint; b) Vance sprayed weeds around the church and parsonage; c) the parsonage trim needs painting and the back deck is rotten and should be removed; the front deck needs painting; d) a tree on the southwest corner of parsonage is leaning on the house and should be removed; e) the A/C in the church was leaking water into the furnace and Klemetsruds have ordered a new pan for it (estimate \$400); f) Ray reprogrammed the thermostat in the sanctuary so no cooling will be on from Sunday evening until Saturday morning. He is working on the one in the large entry way; g) the outdoor sign should be replaced, and will take a good deal of work to remove it. Perry noted there are funds of \$1500 from the Elsberry memorial. Arlene suggested this would be a good project for memorial funds. Perry provided a mockup of a possible outdoor sign, which Ray will investigate.

The insurance inspection was completed with only a few things pointed out, including emergency lighting batteries and a fire extinguisher in the parsonage. Ray asked if the old insurance policies can be thrown out; if no pending claims, they can be disposed of.

Staff Parish Relations Report: No report given, committee plans to meet in August.

Missions Report: Our next brunch is September 29th. We will resume the One Thing project in September. May consider a back to school program for school supplies.

Endowment Report: Laurel updated us on the consolidation of funds held in many CD's. An account has been set up at Ramsey Bank in the trust dept. Funds have been placed, other than one remaining CD, to avoid a penality. Kelli is working on a format for reporting to the endowment committee. Good progress has been made with the change.

UMW Report: No report available.

Education Committee Report: No report available.

Youth Group Report: Pastor Lori reported that Nancy contacted parents of middle school students and asked that one of them replace her for devotions, lessons, etc.

Worship Committee Report: Committee has not met.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Lori reported on her initial meeting for the first phase of her non-profit leadership course held in Mitchell, SD recently. By July 2020, she will have completed the course. She finds it interesting, with many uncertainties that will become clearer as time goes on and believes that this will be beneficial to our church. The main focus is an applied project. Our church will be consulted about its most primary need and work with Lori on the project, with discussions to follow in the next month. She has an assigned coach, an individual with varied business experience, and conferences with him bi-weekly. She has 9 or 10 courses to complete by July 2020. She returns to Mitchell next year but has a mid-year retreat near Brookings in January 2020. She will update the congregation through newsletters.

Pastor Lori related that the metal church sign on the building was taken down and repainted by Clint Oehkle.

There will be a Breakthrough Prayer training on August 25th, in conjunction with a potluck after service. An invitation will be extended to some churches in our area. This date is also our summer joint service with Spirit Lake. Registration for the event is included in August newsletter. She suggests that we solicit as many people from our church as possible, as we are the host church.

Out Conference treasurer reports that church will receive a rebate check from its pension fund in the amount of. \$3,836.57.

Old Business: Grace Sharbono's family is hosting an 80th birthday reception for her following worship on August 4th.

New Business: Tana introduced the idea of a one-day mission trip at Spirit Lake reservation, maybe in September. Mike Flowers needs list of people and skills. More on this will be shared with the congregation on August 25th. The faith walks on Mondays at 7:00 pm are going well, there is always room for more, including men and youth.

Meeting was adjourned. Pastor Lori dismissed us with a prayer. The next meeting is Wednesday, August 21, 2019 at 7:00 pm
